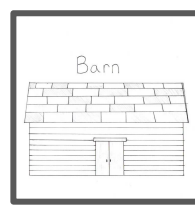
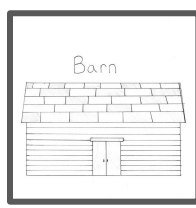
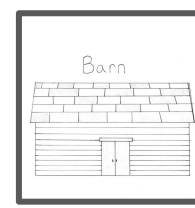
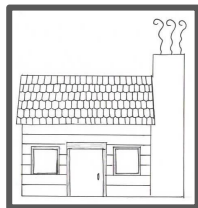
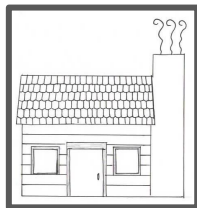
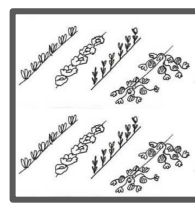
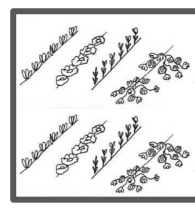
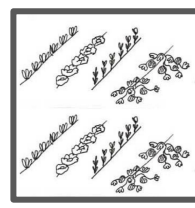
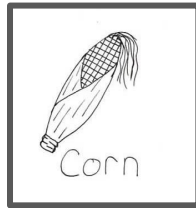
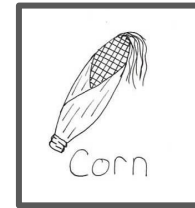
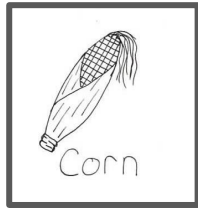
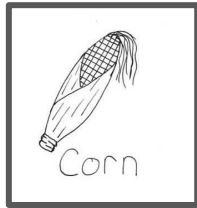
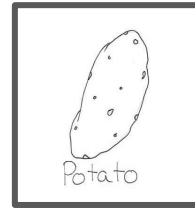
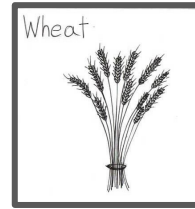
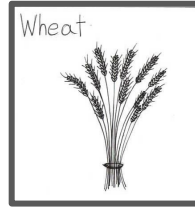
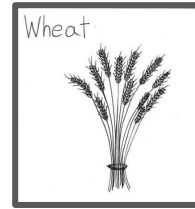
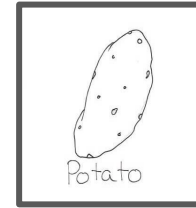
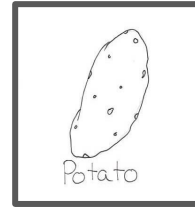
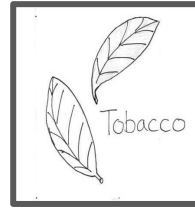
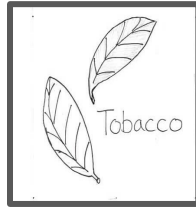
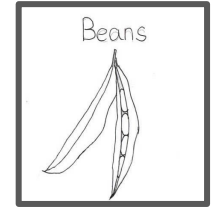
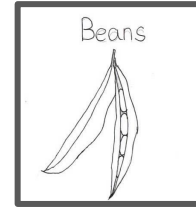
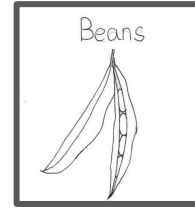
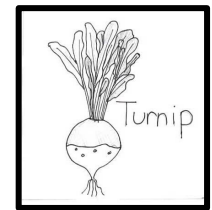
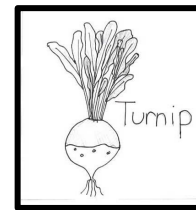
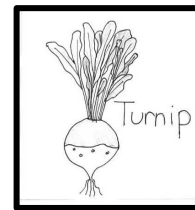
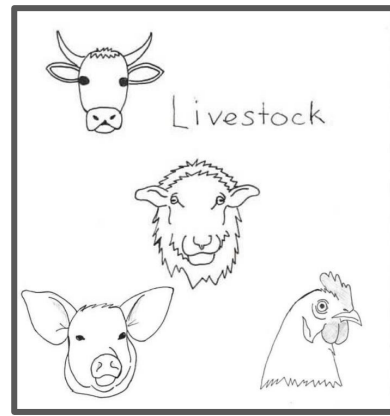
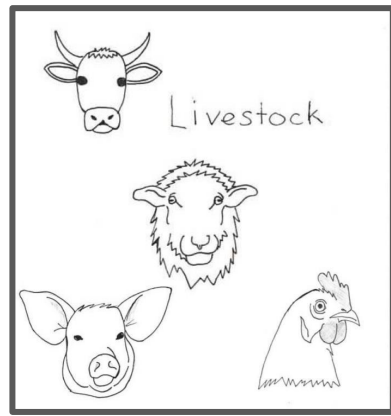
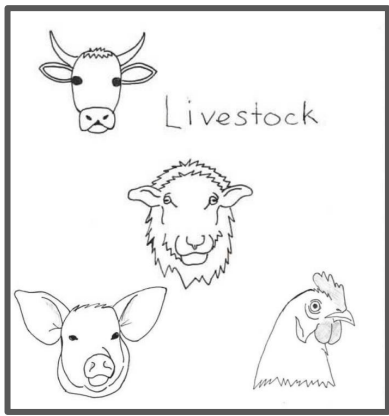
Remember what promises you made in your lease:

- 2 houses and 2 barns

- Orchard, apple and peach trees: *1,000 trees take up approximately 24 acres*
- Undeveloped land for timber: *Most tenant farmers left about a quarter of the land as untouched woodland*

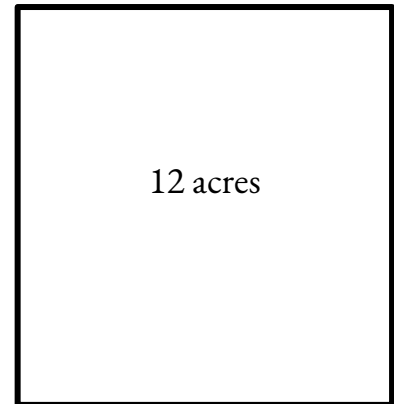

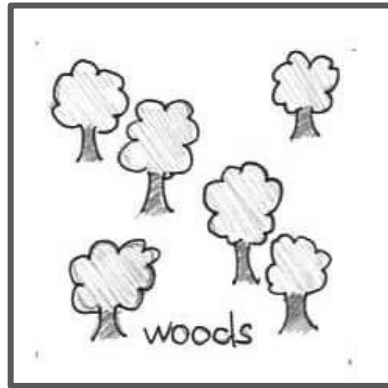
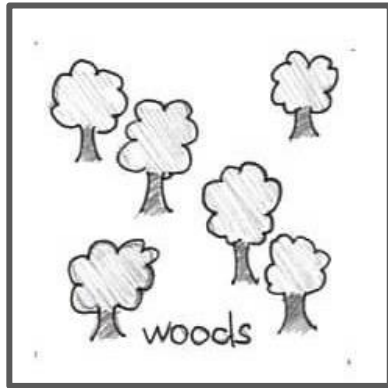
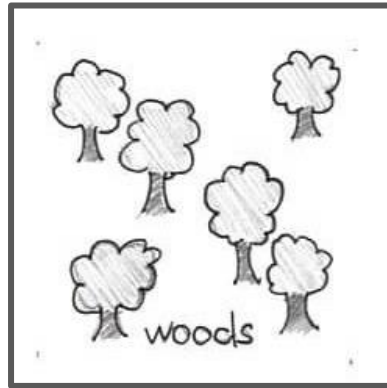
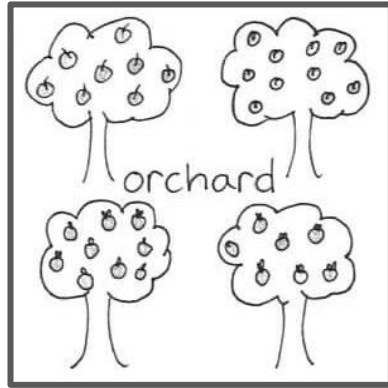
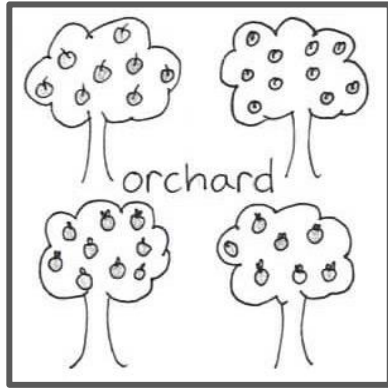
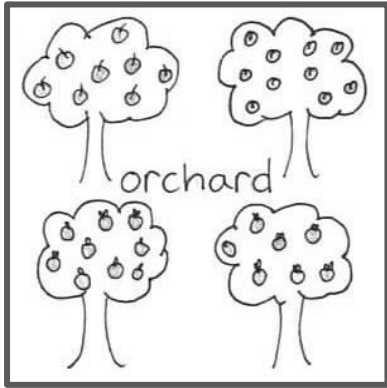
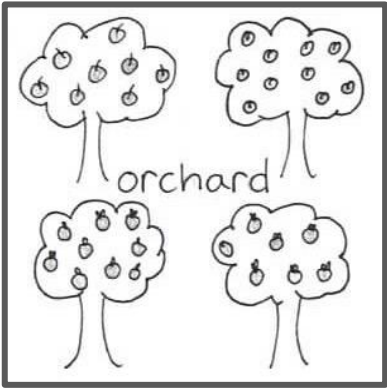
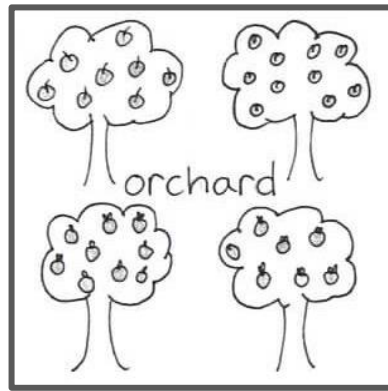
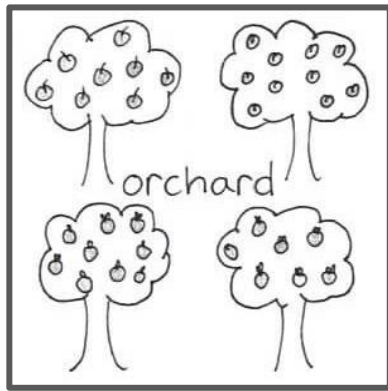
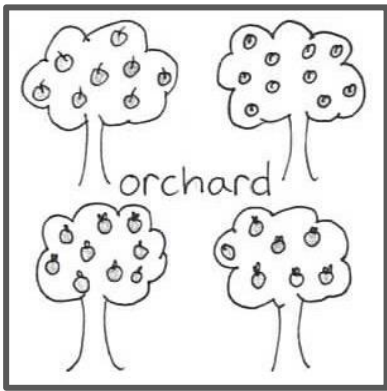
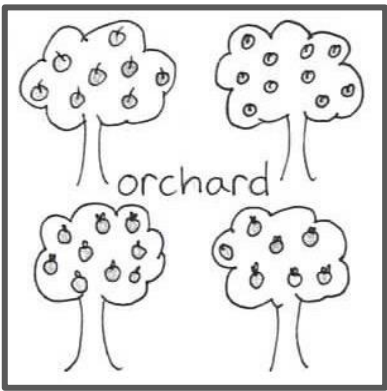
- Sustenance crops and additional crops that could go to market, *a family could work, and needed, approximately 1 acre of garden to live on.*
